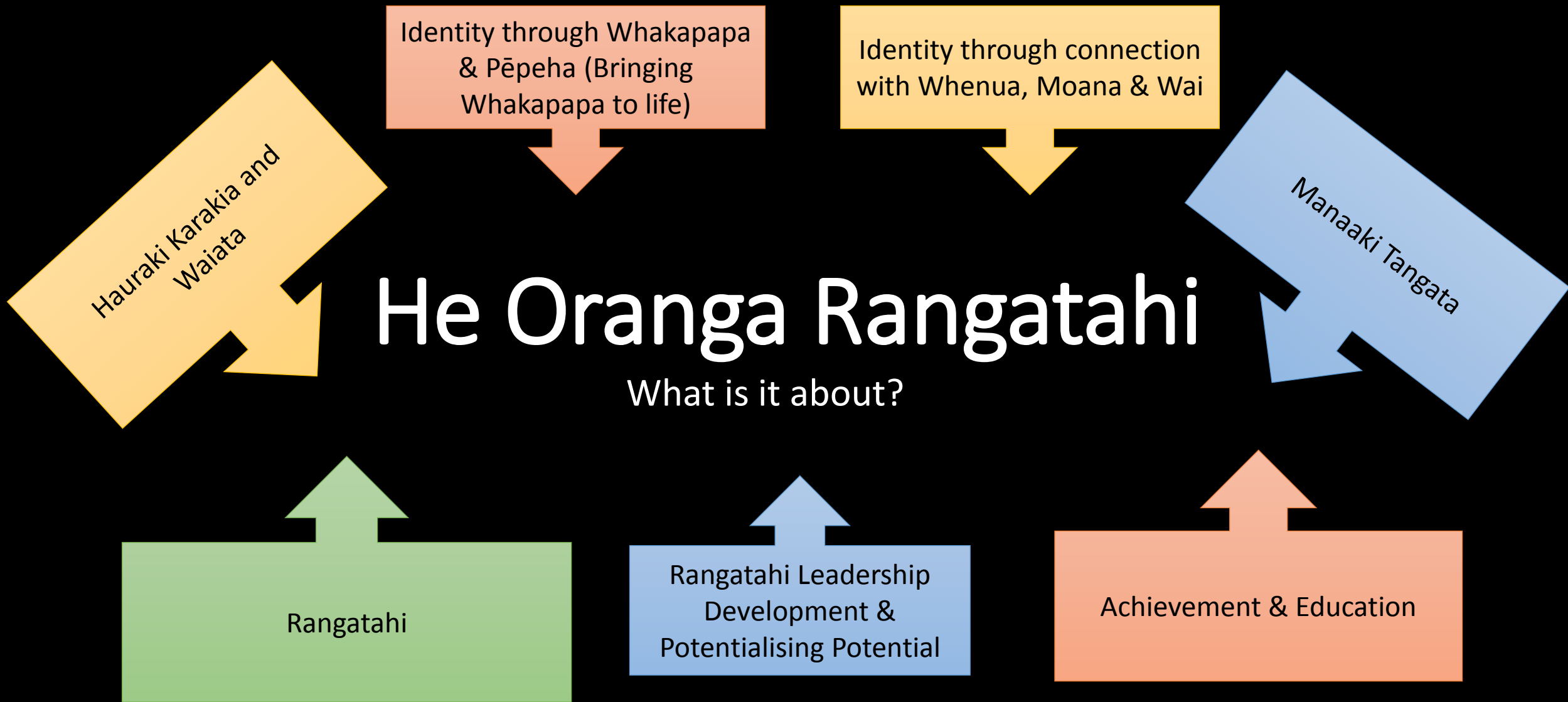

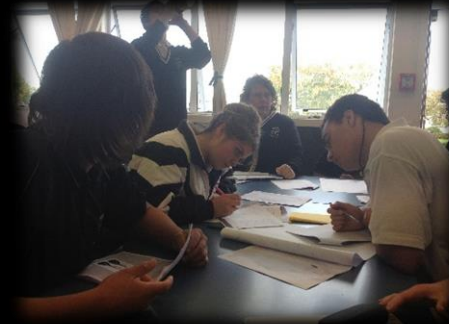

# Outcome of First Phase?

- 35 Maori Students retained in school
- NCEA level 1-3
- Developing as leaders and proud of their maori roots
- Self esteem and confidence
- Positive community engagement
- Whanau involvement in change
- Teachers notice positive change
- Fitter, Healthier, eating healthier
- Moved into tertiary study – social work, cooking, hospitality, fitness
